Membership for the calendar year is \$20 single, \$35 family.



Your registration is not confirmed until your payment has cleared & both AEF & ATRA memberships have been verified. AEF not required for non-riding clinics. No post-date cheques or spots held without full payment. No refunds after registration deadline unless a vacancy can be filled. We appreciate horses attending are healthy and up to date worming, shots and farrier. Please withdraw if your horse is sick or has been in contact with sick horses within 3 weeks prior to clinic. Waivers are required at most facilities. Unless otherwise noted: no charge for spectators at riding clinics, no food is provided so bring your own lunch, and any clinic not 80% filled by deadline will be cancelled.

**July 5-8 Writing-On-Stone, Milk River.** I have contacted Les O'Hara to guide us on Saturday & Sunday, as you can't get into this area without him. Shoes are not required. We can arrive Friday evening to camp at the rodeo grounds and leave Monday morning. The fee for camping and the guide will be \$40-80/rider depending on numbers.
